As we get closer to the end of the semester, we are collecting our hardware and preparing for the upcoming semester.

About 40% of our inventory was not returned.

- We need your support in enforcing our policies so that we can provide these resources to future students.
- This may result in loss of enrollment and students having to drop classes.
- It is no longer allowed for students to hold on to technology semester-tosemester.
- The library loans Chromebooks, PC laptops, hotspots, and calculators for 3 months at a time.
- Put in requests as soon as possible.
- Computers are now being remotely deactivated (bricked) if not returned.
- Library holds are being used as a last resort, as it may impact a student's enrollment.
