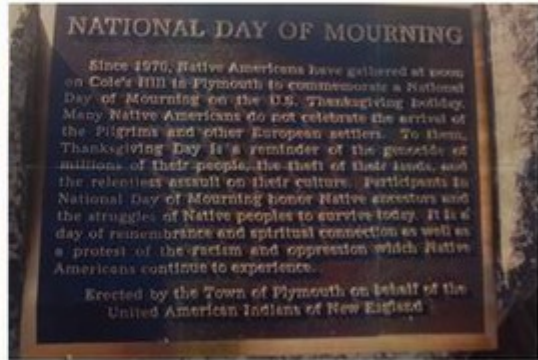
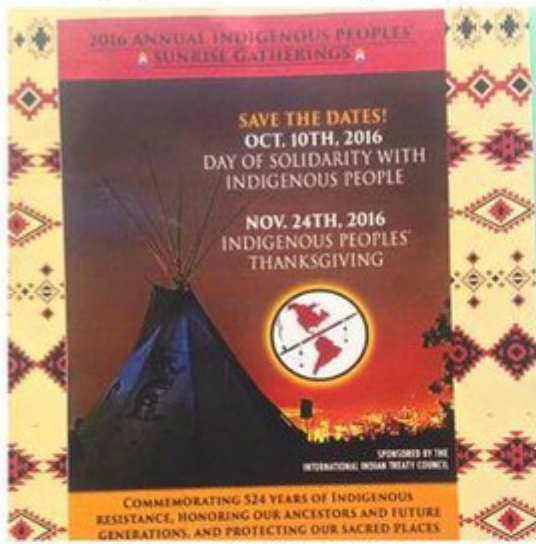


## Students: Book a Research Appointment

## November is Native American History Month

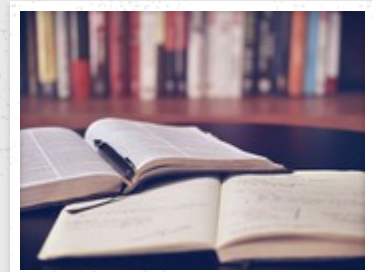
November is National Native American Heritage month. We have information on Standing Rock, the Indigenous Peoples' Sunrise Gathering on Alcatraz, and more.

### From Cañada College to Congress: Ann Eshoo



Anna Eshoo, Cañada College, class of '75, now represents the area where she lives and attended college. The only member of Congress of Assyrian descent and one of only two members in Congress of Armenian descent (the other is Congressional Representative Jackie Speier), Ms. Eshoo earned an associate of arts in English from Cañada College within a decade of the college's official opening. Congresswoman Eshoo serves on the Energy and Commerce Committee's Subcommittee on Communications and Technology, the first woman in the history of the Subcommittee to serve in a leadership role. Congresswoman Eshoo also works to expand high-speed, affordable broadband, protect electronic privacy as well as an open internet and to ensure net neutrality protections.
