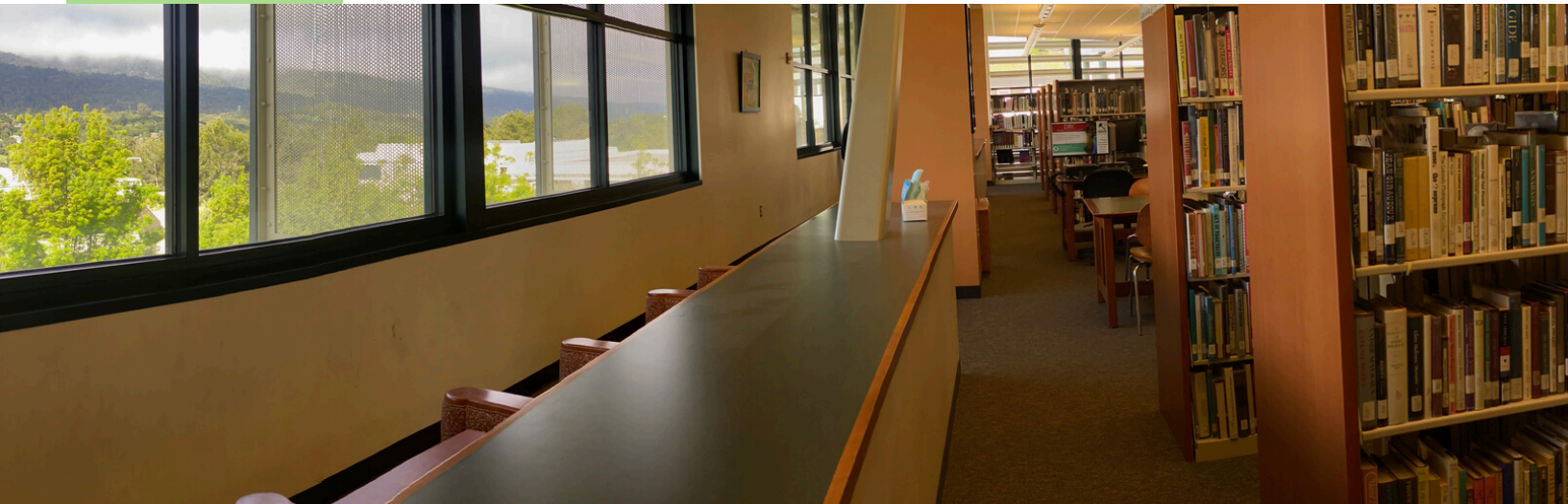

Juneteenth is the federal holiday in which we celebrate emancipation of enslaved people in the U.S. It was first celebrated in Texas in 1865.

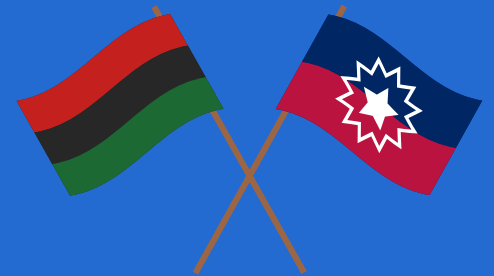


What do finances and economic reparations for U.S. descendants of slavery have to do with each other? From here to equality : reparations for Black Americans in the twenty-first century looks at both the past and the present to measure the inequalities borne of slavery.

Juneteenth is a novel about a Black man who passes for White and becomes a race-baiting U.S. senator. When he is shot on the Senate floor, the first visitor in hospital is a Black musician-turned-preacher who raised him. As the two men talk, their respective stories come out.



Miss Juneteenth is a fun Summer film about a former beauty queen and single mom who prepares her rebellious teenage daughter for the "Miss Juneteenth" pageant.

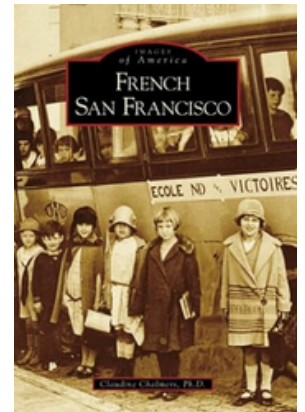
Did you know July is **French American Month**?

Cooking a French-American recipe from [French-American Cooking from New Orleans to Quebec](#). There's also dozens of French restaurants on the Peninsula!

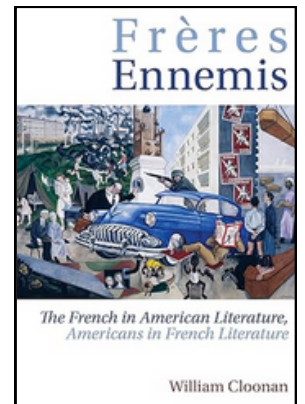


Reading about local French culture with [French San Francisco](#). Maybe you can visit some local places with French history you wouldn't have known were there.



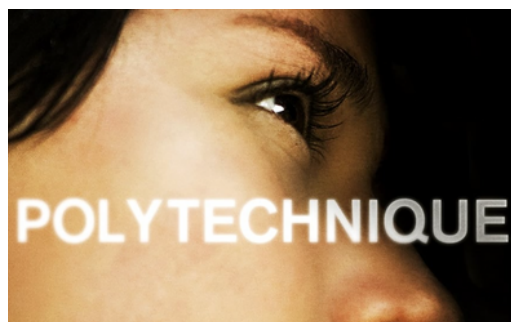
