

How to Check Out Technology in 5 Easy Steps

NEED A MOBILE HOTSPOT, GOOGLE CHROMEBOOK, OR GRAPHING CALCULATOR? CAÑADA COLLEGE LIBRARY CAN HELP!

- 1. Come to the library circulation desk to request technology.
- 2. Present a valid photo ID (student ID, driver license, state ID, passport).
- 3. Your enrollment will be verified and you will be directed to complete an online <u>Cañada College Library Technology Loan Agreement Form</u>.
- 4. Items will be checked out to you for 3 months at a time.
- 5. After 3 months, you can renew the technology by bringing it to the library front desk to be checked for maintenance.
